## NEXT YEAR'S NEW VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS

As the end of the year nears, it is time to think into the future. Families need to pay particular attention if you have a child **entering Kindergarten** or **7<sup>th</sup> grade** (previously 6<sup>th</sup> grade). **Wisconsin requires a minimum of immunization or a written waiver.** Now is the time to plan ahead as you have until the beginning of the next school year to get your child immunized.

- Students entering Grades 7 through 12 are required to have a Tdap (the adolescent combination vaccine for tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis) within the past 5 years of entering the grade.
- Students entering Grades K through 12 will require a second varicella (chickenpox) vaccine. If your child had a natural case of chicken pox, then the vaccine is not necessary, but you may be required to provide medical documentation of the disease.
- **You need to supply the school with the name of the vaccine and the date (month, day, and year) the vaccine was given.**

If your child is not fully immunized and you do not provide a waiver to the school, your child may be excluded from attending school until all information is provided. Be sure to keep a permanent record for yourself. In the future, your child may need to supply these dates to other schools or employers.

A Student Immunization Record will be sent home in May to the families who have children in the grades affected by the law. *You may need to double check with your physician or the Immunization Registry to be sure the missing immunizations have not been given.* Please be sure not to wait until the beginning of school to address this need as area doctor clinics and the Health Department become very busy with long waits.

If you have questions, please call your doctor, the local Health Department, or the school nurse, Sam Mertens, RN at 920-398-4112. You can find additional information about immunization requirements at <http://dhs.wisconsin.gov/immunization/index.htm>.

## BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING MINUTES

The March 8, 2023 meeting of the Board of Education of the Markesan District Schools was called to order by President Clark at 5:30 p.m. with nine members present. Mr. Kuehn was absent. Motion by Abendroth/Krueger to approve the agenda as presented carried 9-0.

Mr. Clark reviewed the voting procedure explaining a majority five votes (rather than six) were needed to appoint the new Board of Education member as only nine Board of Education members were present. Motion by Fenske/Lemke to approve the voting procedure as presented and amend-

ed to indicate a majority five votes (rather than six) were needed to appoint the new Board of Education member as only nine Board of Education members were present carried 9-0.

Four candidates expressed interest in the Towns of Mackford, Fox Lake and Alto seat. The following candidates were present to answer questions from the Board of Education: Amy Newton, Dan Huitema and Jake Vande Berg. The following candidate appeared via telephone to answer questions from the Board of Education: David Cotterill.

The ballots were distributed, collected and tallied showing Jake Vande Berg as receiving four votes, David Cotterill as receiving three votes and Amy Newton as receiving two votes.

The ballots were again distributed, collected and tallied showing Jake Vande Berg as receiving six votes and David Cotterill as receiving three votes; therefore, Jake Vande Berg was appointed to the Board of Education – Towns of Mackford, Fox Lake and Alto seat.

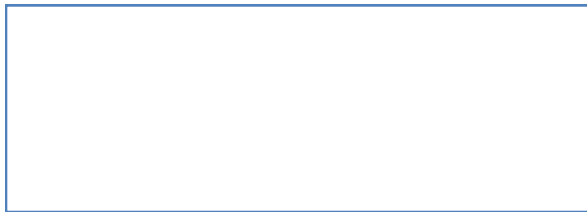
