GUIDELINES FOR KEEPING YOUR CHILD HOME

As we emerge from a COVID world, Markesan Schools would like to remind parents of our guidelines.

When should I keep my child home from school? Answers: Keep your child home when...

*<u>Oral temperature above 100.0 F. He/she should be free of</u> <u>fever for 24 hours without medications such as Tylenol or</u> <u>Ibuprofen.</u>

- *Cold symptoms serious enough to interfere with child's ability to learn.
- *Cough causing difficulty breathing or moderate to severe chest pain.
- *Undiagnosed rash or open sores with drainage.
- *Headache severe enough to interfere with learning.

*Abdominal pain accompanied by elevated temperature, vomiting, or diarrhea.

- *Diarrhea or vomiting within the past 24 hours.
- *Sore throat serious enough to interfere with swallowing or accompanied by fever or rash.
- *Head lice infestation. Students may return to school once live lice treated and nits (eggs) removed.
- *"Pinkeye," if drainage present or discomfort/itching interferes with learning.
- *Any bacterial infection until student has been on antibiotics therapy for 24 hours.

VISION SCREENING AT SCHOOL By: Sam Mertens, RN, NCSN

The Markesan District Schools local Lions will be assisting with vision screening using the Spot Vision Screen Camera this fall. We saw great success with the screening in past years, so we are going to screen the entire Elementary this year.

You may wonder what this screener camera is. According to Welch Allyn "the Spot Vision Screener is a handheld, portable device designed to help users quickly and easily detect vision issues on patients from 6 months of age through adult. Spot screens both eyes at once from a nonthreatening 3foot distance." It is used to screen for visual acuity, eye alignment, unequal refractive power (one eye sees better than the other), and astigmatism. The actual screening process takes about 30 seconds to complete.

Parents will be notified via letter if a professional vision exam is recommended. This screen is in no way intended to replace a professional eye exam because it does not detect disease or other problems with the eyes or surrounding structures.

If you do not want your child screened, please notify the school in writing by October 7. If you opted out of screening in past years, you will still need to notify the school in writing annually.
