## NEXT YEAR'S VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS By Sam Mertens, RN, NCSN

As the end of the year nears, it is time to think into the future. Families need to pay particular attention if you have a child entering Kindergarten or Grade 7 (previously $6^{\text {th }}$ grade). Wisconsin requires a minimum of immunization or a written waiver. Now is the time to plan ahead as you have until the beginning of the next school year to get your child immunized.

Students entering Grades 7 through 12 are required to have a Tdap (the adolescent combination vaccine for tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis) within the past 5 years of entering the grade.
Students entering Grades K through 12 will require a second varicella (chickenpox) vaccine. If your child had a natural case of chicken pox, then the vaccine is not necessary.

You need to supply the school with the name of the vaccine and the date (month, day, and year) the vaccine was given. If your child is not fully immunized and you do not provide a waiver to the school, your child may be excluded from attending school until all information is provided. Be sure to keep a permanent record for yourself. In the future, your child may need to supply these dates to other schools or employers.
A Student Immunization Record will be sent home in May to the families who have children in the grades affected by the law. You may need to double check with your physician or the Immunization Registry to be sure the missing immunizations have not been given. Please do not to wait until the beginning of school to address this need as area doctor clinics and the Health Department become very busy with long waits.

If you have questions, please call your doctor, the local Health Department, or the school nurse, Sam Mertens, RN at 920-3984112. Families can access the Wisconsin Immunization Registry by going to https://www.dhfswir.org/.

Please remember you need to provide the information to the school for it to be in our records.
